Course – Starting your own Business

Course Description

This course will cover registering a business, insuring a business, tax compliance, asset protection, business plans, lines of credit, and more. At the end of the course, we will try to pair each student with a mentor within their intended industry to help coach them and help them through challenges.

Prof. James Chapman is an attorney and professor in Carbondale. He has taught many entrepreneurial courses for inmates returning to society.

Martin Reyes is a successful business owner. He has been to prison 4 times.

Day 3:

Day 4: Summary. Learn about inspirational speaking.

Final Quiz

Final Assignment: In order to pass the course, each student will be asked to complete a final exam. The final exam will be in VERBAL essay format, asking the student to outline the steps they would go through to start his business. Ex: What will you name your business? What will your business do and in which industry? Who will your customers be? What will be your cost of business and what sort of return do you expect to be able to justify that cost? Does your business require any special licensing or certifications? Does your business require assets like a semi-truck or a store front? What sort of insurance does your business require? How will you get it registered? Will your business require start-up money or funding, and how will you acquire that? Each student will explain their individualized formula for business and be graded on it's likelihood of success. Present your ideas to the shark tank (faculty).
