It saved my life." - Hinda Client For over 40 years, the <u>Hinda Institute</u> has provided counseling, visitation, and support predominantly to Jews who have encountered the criminal justice system. Our goal is to lower recidivism rates and ensure that those coming out of correctional institutions do not return. The Hinda Institute is a beacon of hope for families facing the harsh realities of the criminal justice system. Many innocent families are torn apart, grappling with financial devastation, emotional turmoil, and a sense of isolation, and we provide a nonjudgemental and caring support system.

Due to the support of our sponsors, the Hinda Institute has provided staggering results in the realm of recidivism. Our pervasive, holistic, and personal approach is responsible for our recidivism rate of less than 10% compared to a national recidivism baseline rate of over 75%.




COUNSELING AND CASEWORK



The Hinda Institute has a unique and critical role in the Jewish community. We assist families and clients desperate for hope, counseling, empathy and resources. We assist in unique areas such as dealing with parole and probation, finding employment and housing postincarceration and legal research. In the past 2 years, our casework has doubled and our staff has grown to include caseworkers, re-entry peer support specialists, counselors, contracted LCSWs and chaplaincy support.

The Hinda Institute's casework and counseling program assists some of the most underserviced and vulnerable, populations in the Jewish Community. Most of our clients are in desperate need and are dealing with severe poverty and employment problems. Additionally, this population faces tremendous challenges in self-esteem and dealing with trauma.

'The Hinda Institute initiated the CARES Family Support Group after we repeatedly heard the realities of the families that had a close family member who was detained. They were devastated financially, were suffering from PTSD often for years, had been "snubbed" in their synagogues and were suffering multiple psychological stresses. Family structures were fractured. The CARES group was a place where voices could be heard and validated.Our survey of the needs of these families in April 2021 found that the impact was even greater for children. Through no fault of their own, the women and children were the unrecognized "collateral damage of crime." -Coordinator of CARES program


REENTRY EDUCATION PROGRAM


Packing food for Passover

The Hinda Institute currently visits 150 to 200 clients every month within federal and state correctional institutions as well as weekly within jails. The Hinda Institute chaplains travel over 45,000 miles across Illinois to visit these Jews who have often been virtually forgotten by their communities. The chaplains offer support to these Jews who are alone in the abyss of prison and give them hope for the future.

MENTAL HEALTH High

There is no dichotomy between mental health and incarceration; 71% of people with mental health issues have encountered the criminal justice system. People with mental health challenges are overrepresented in our nation's jails and prisons. Additionally, people with mental health issues often use drugs to treat their unresolved mental health issues.

Of reentry clients have mental health challenges. This is due to trauma, Post Incarceration Syndrome (PICS) or disorders such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and/or anxiety.

We are committed to providing support to one of the most under-serviced, vulnerable, and stigmatized populations suffering from mental health issues within the Jewish community. Hinda provides support or a link throughout long referral processes finding expert services that are sensitive to justice-impacted individuals.
